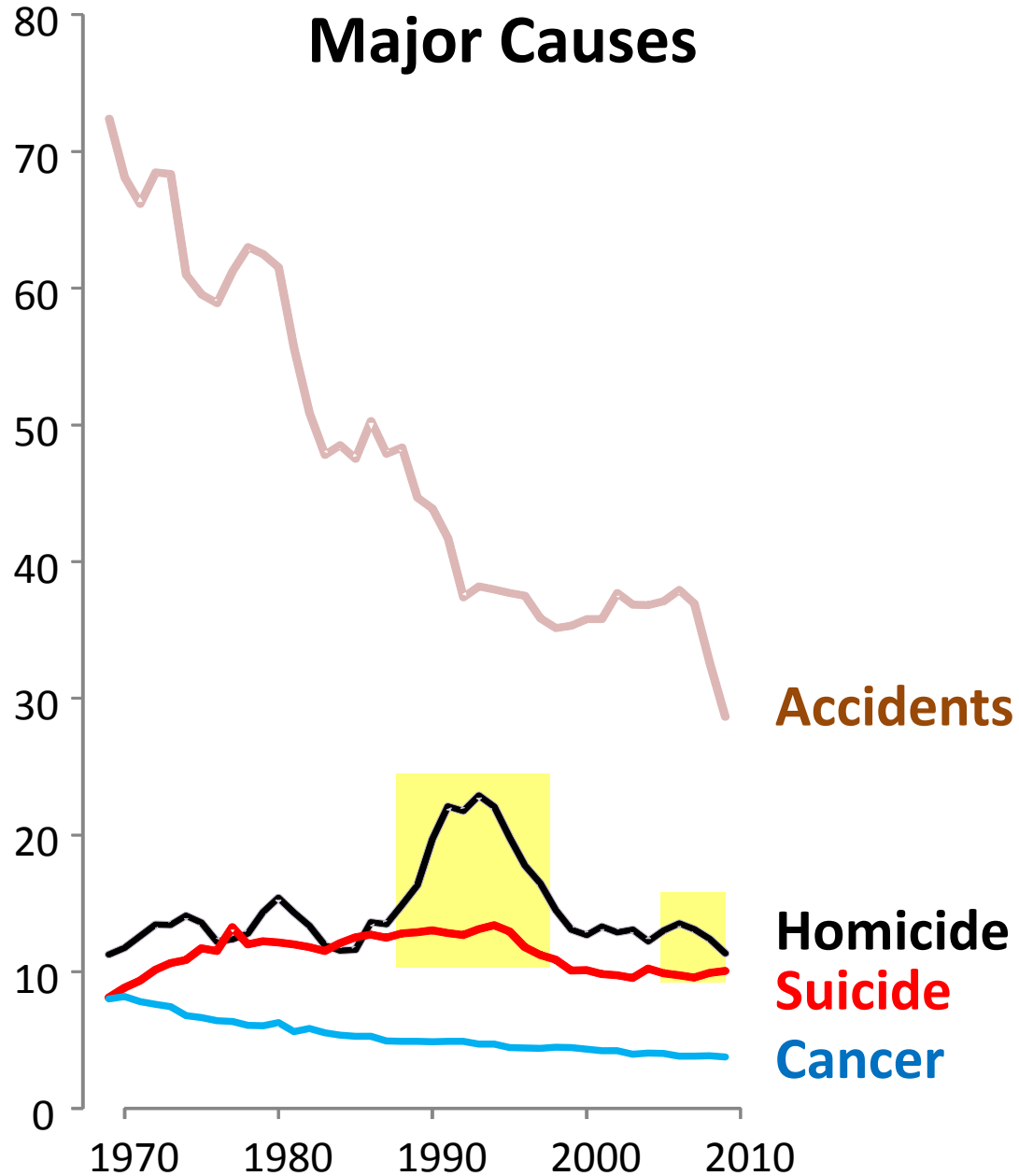


# Annual Death Rate, Age 15-24, USA, 1969-2009

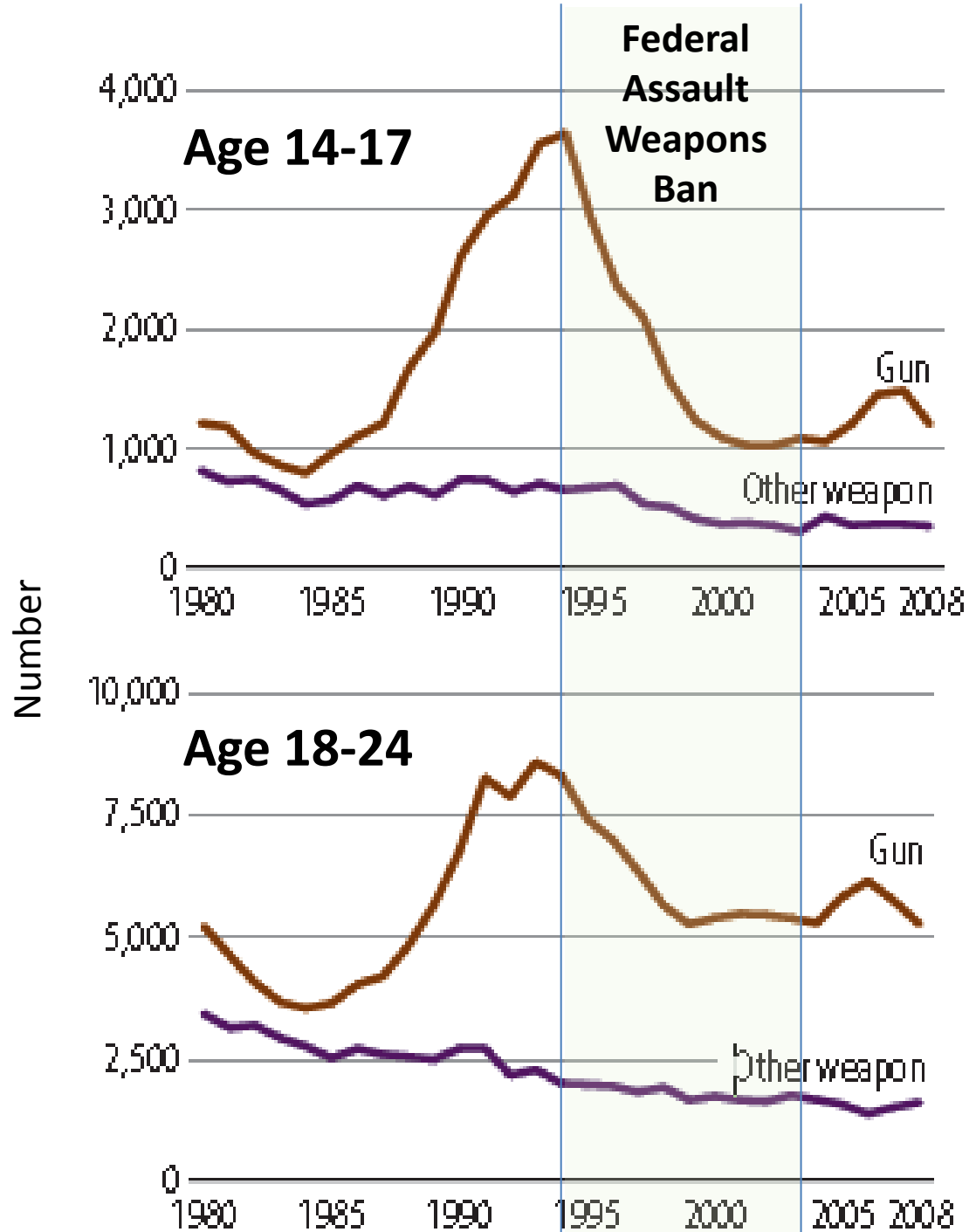

# Homicides by Weapon Type

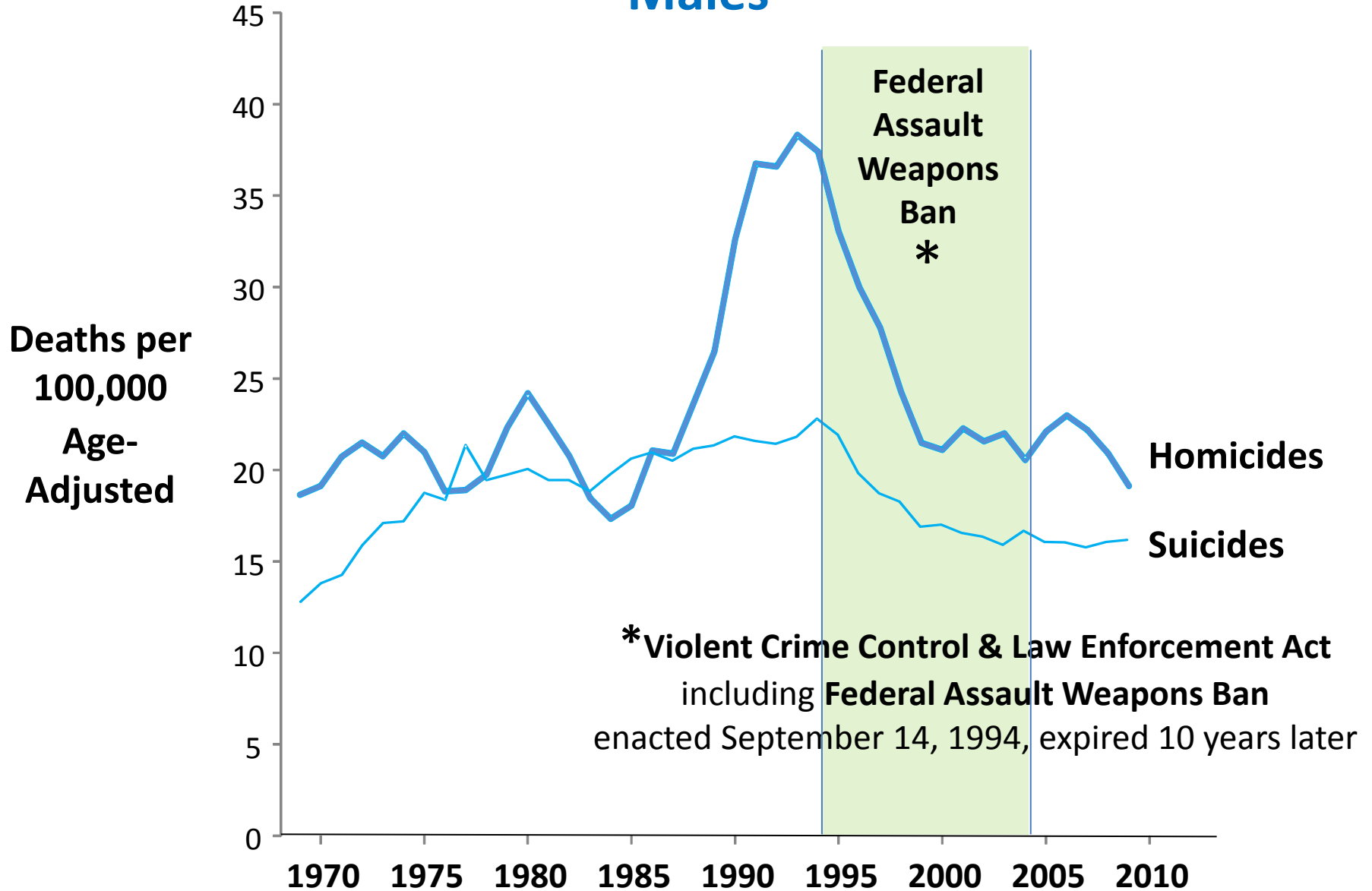

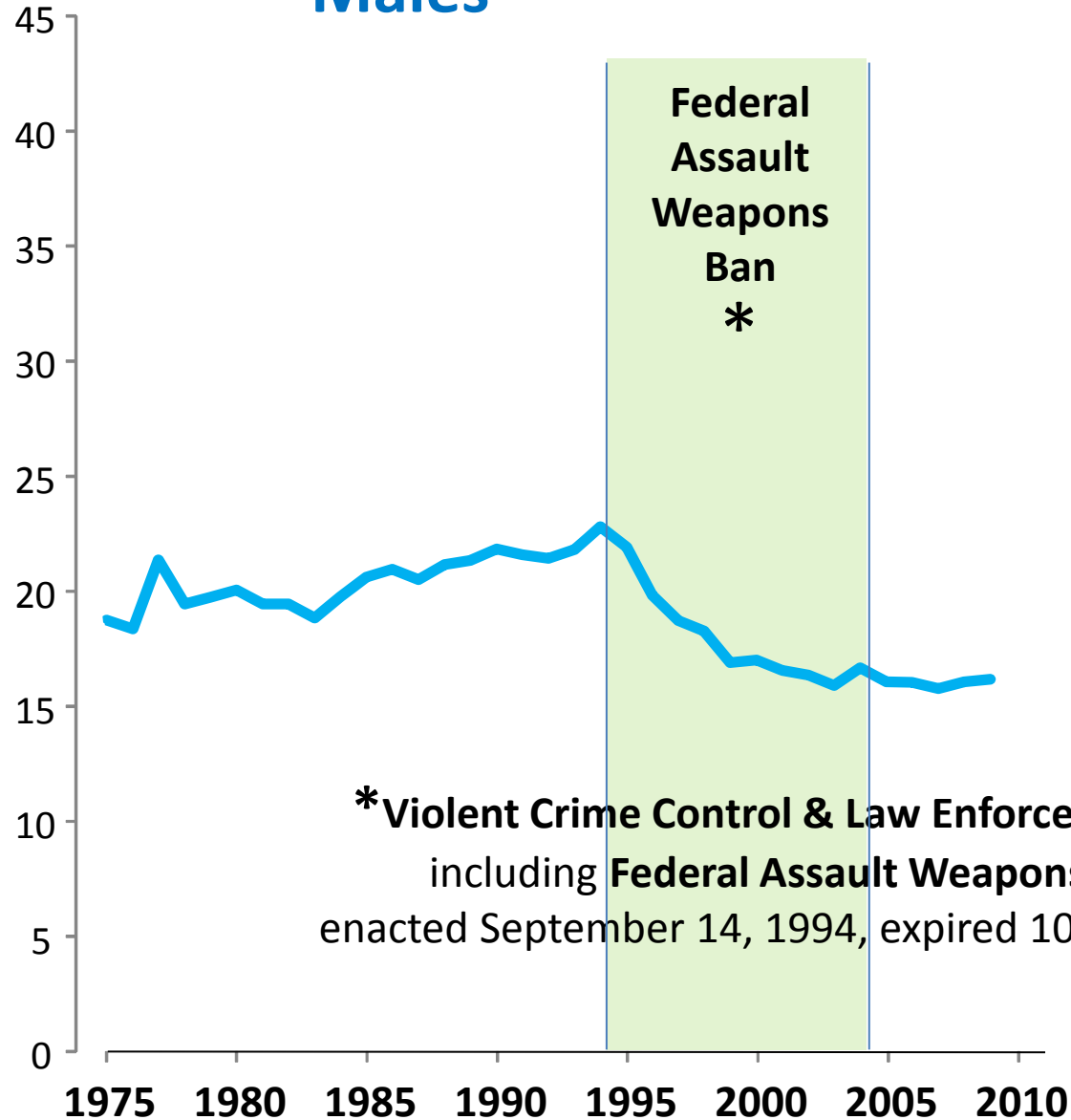

# Annual **Suicide** Rate, Age **15-24**, U.S., 1975-2009

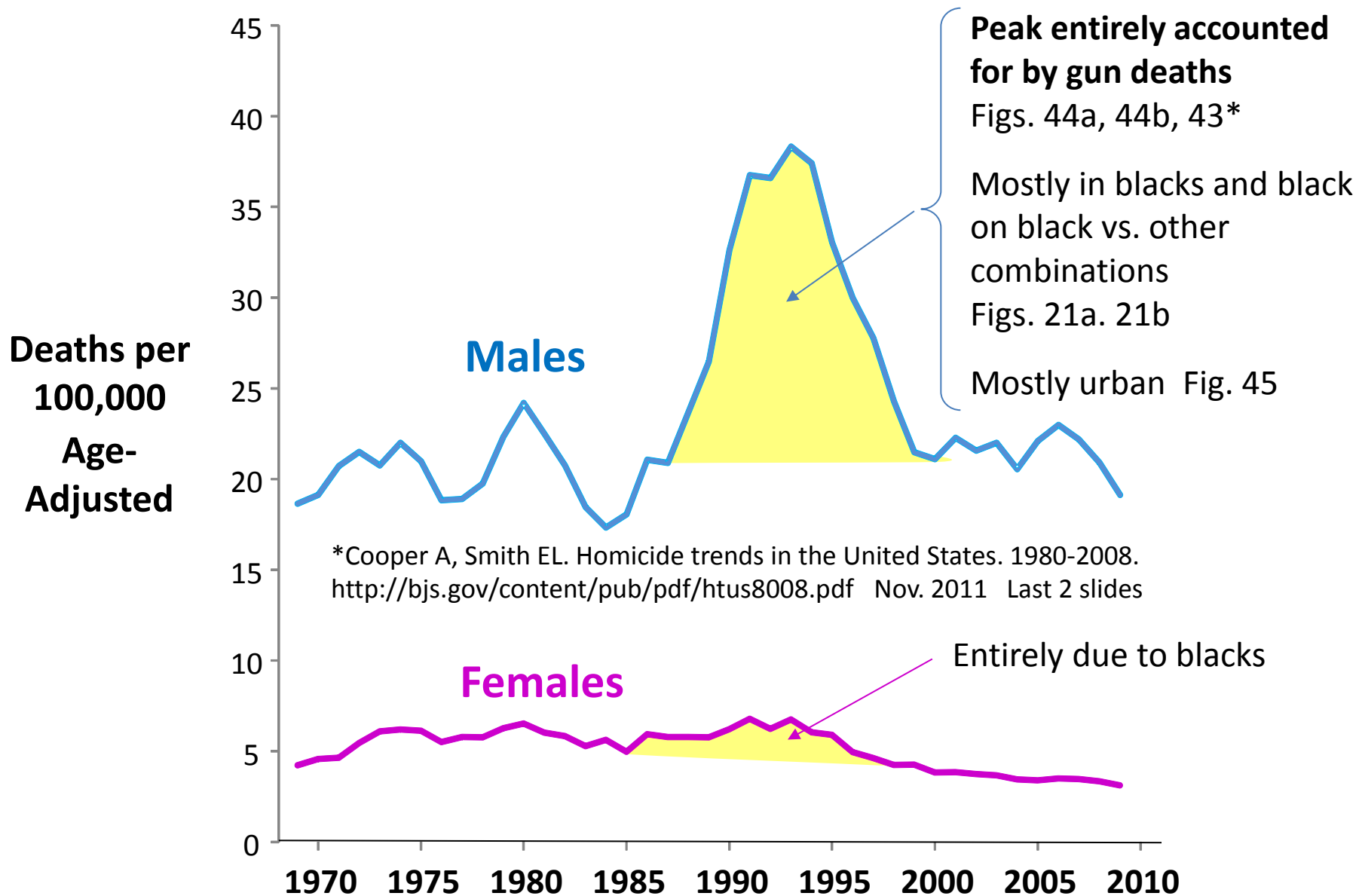

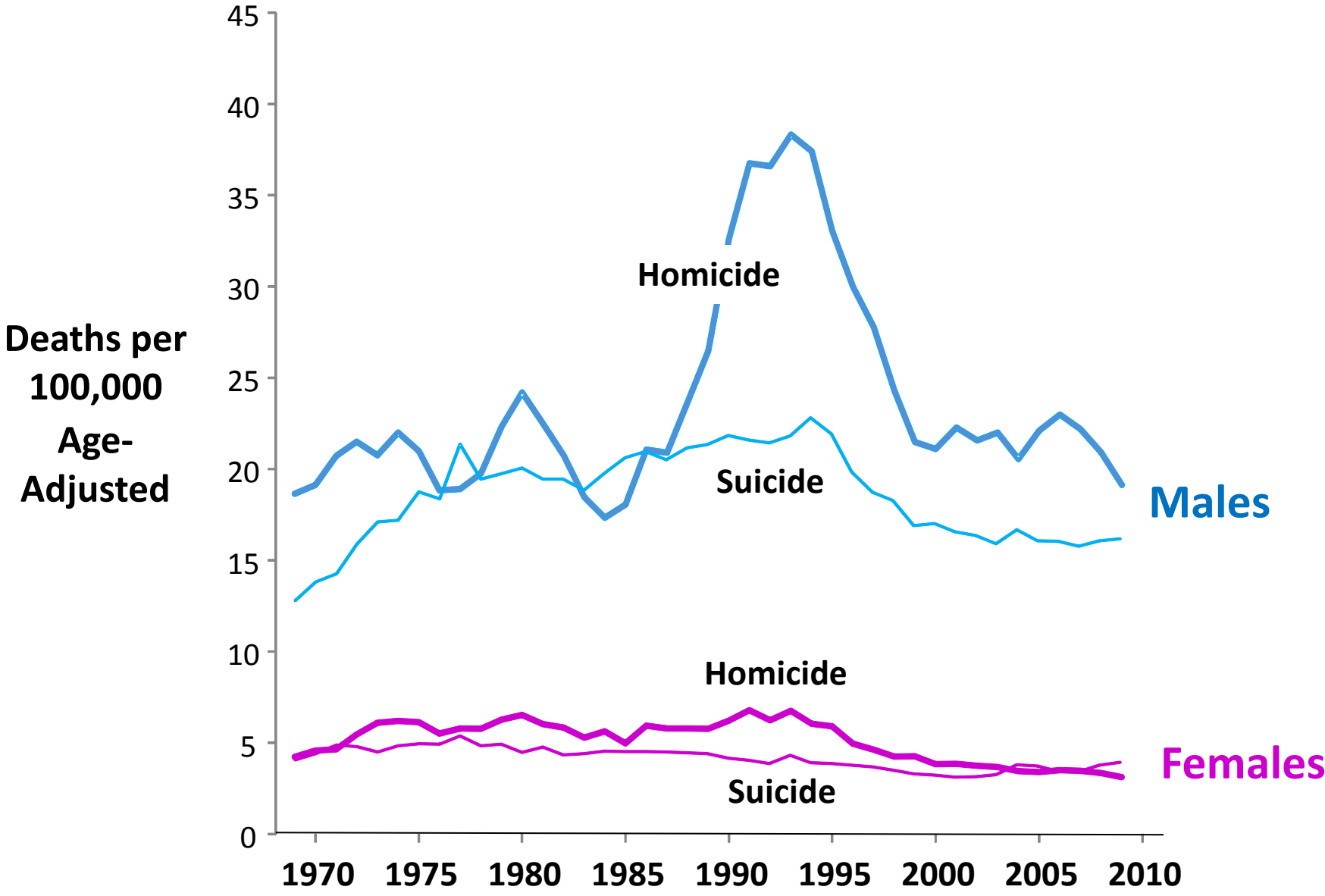

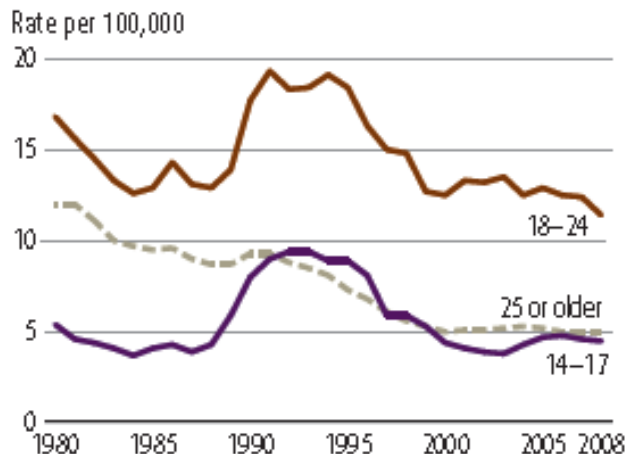

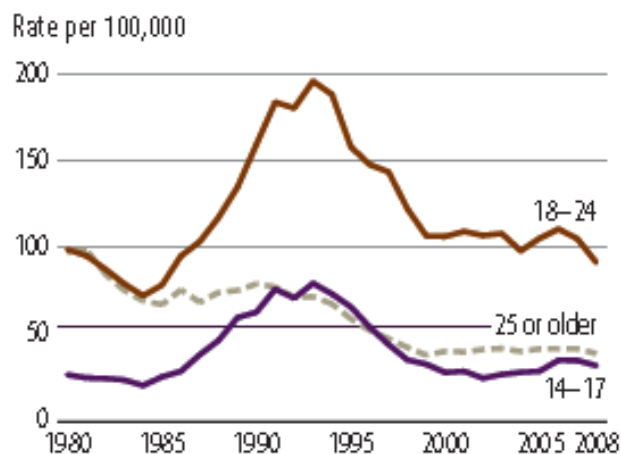
**FIGURE 21a**

**White male homicide victimization rates, by age, 1980-2008**



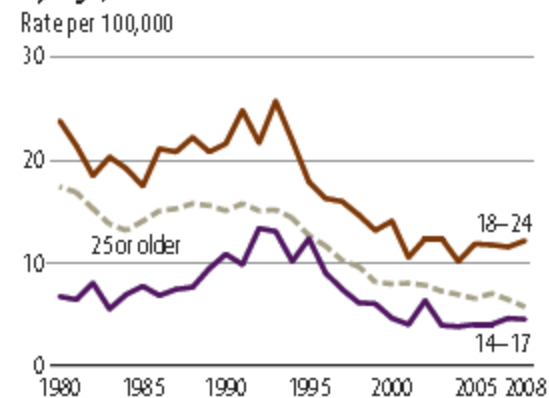
**FIGURE 21b**

**Black male homicide victimization rates, by age, 1980-2008**

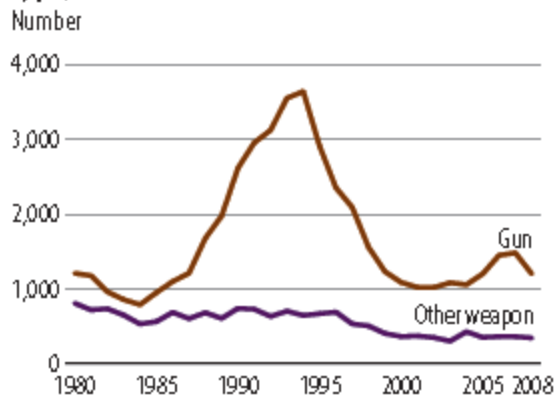


**FIGURE 21d**

**Black female homicide victimization rates, by age, 1980-2008**

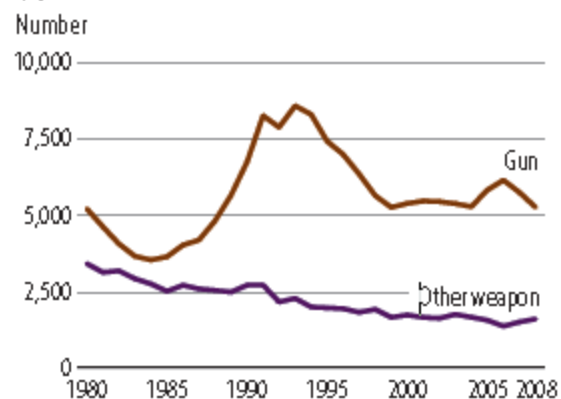


**FIGURE 44a**  
Homicide offenders age 14 to 17, by weapon type, 1980-2008

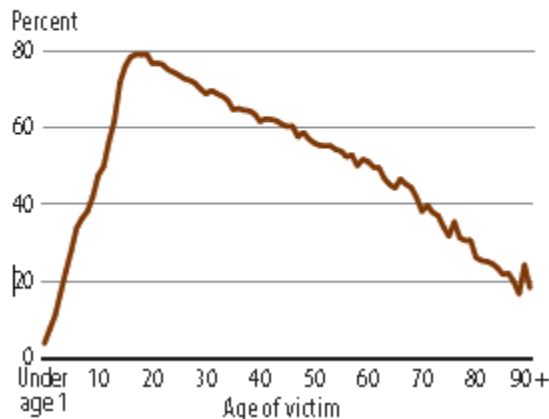

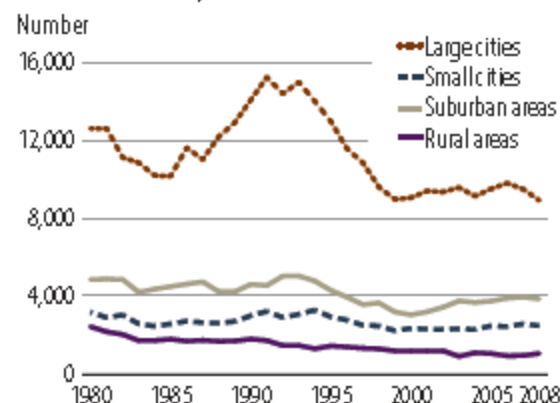
**FIGURE 44b**
